
Term: Therapy

You may find that your baby's NICU has therapists on staff to help with this and/or that your baby will be prescribed a variety of therapies to receive

Some Types of Therapy: Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Speech Therapy, Vision Therapy, Music Therapy, Feeding Specialists.



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Tips: Premie Parents are Powerful (Part I)

They say hindsight is 20/20 and that is so true. Deb Discenza, Publisher at PremieWorld, gives insight into what she believes Premie Parents in the NICU right now should know for sure:

Know that a premie parent's love is medicine. After having my daughter at 30-weeks gestation and later staring into her incubator in the NICU, I felt so lost, so useless as a parent. Nothing felt natural to me in those first few days and weeks. What did I know? I figured the medical staff knew more than I did. I wondered if it would matter at all if I was by her side in the NICU during the stay. What I know now is that the gentle lullabies I sang to my daughter while holding her,

the Kangaroo Care sessions we did, the books I read to her – they *all* were a form of medicine as well. I helped to soothe her, as did my husband. Relieving her stress in the NICU chaos gave her the ability to rest and to sleep, which in turn helped her to grow and to thrive. That “medicine” continued at home where we worked through numerous developmental delays and took on a lot of therapies over the years. Yet it all came down to a moment this past week when my thriving 11.5 year old said, “Mom, thank you for all you do for me. You do a lot and I love you.” Love is the most powerful medicine of all.
