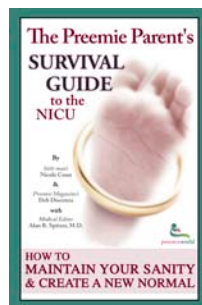
Tools and Resources

Term: Therapy

Therapy: Anything being done to treat your baby for any condition. Most commonly, therapy is used to help stimulate your baby’s body to heal itself and catch-up in developmental milestones. You may find that your baby’s NICU has therapists on staff to help with this and/or that your baby will be prescribed a variety of therapies to receive

once home. All of it is helpful and will make a difference for your baby down the road.

Some Types of Therapy: Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Speech Therapy, Vision Therapy, Music Therapy, Feeding Specialists.

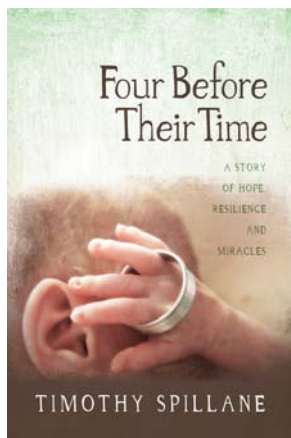

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UPDATE: International Neonatal Consortium

In early March Deb Discenza attended the 2nd International Neonatal Consortium at the FDA.

With neonatal drugs often being a minimized dosing of adult medications, not enough research has been done to 1) check the effectiveness of these medicines and 2) to consider new therapies specifically for this field. [The International Neonatal Consortium](#) recently convened at the FDA to take steps to rectify this across the areas of Retinopathy of Prematurity (ROP), Infections and Necrotizing Enterocolitis (NEC), hemodynamics (conditions relating to blood pressure), seizures and Bronchopulmonary Dysplasia (BPD).
