Preemie Terms: Bilirubin/Bili Lights

Bilirubin/Bili Lights:

Bilirubin is the breakdown product made by the body from old red blood cells that are being removed from the circulation. Bilirubin is processed through the liver, but many premature infants' livers are too underdeveloped to process the by-product known as bilirubin from the blood. This leftover bilirubin accumulates and travels throughout the body



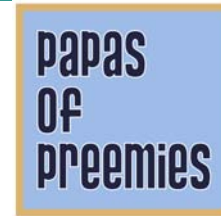
and turns the skin yellow (a condition known as **jaundice**). Bili lights are phototherapy light sources, which help to resolve this issue. Note the old Model-T goggles Becky wears to keep her eyes protected from the lights (see picture).

Questions to Ask the Doctor:

- What is my child's bilirubin level today?
- My child still needs the bili lights, do you have an idea what is causing this to extend in time?
- What else can be done to help my child with this?
