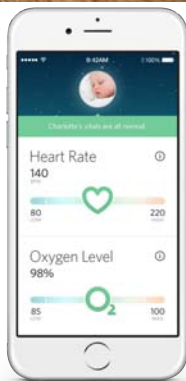


Owlet Baby Vitals Monitor
